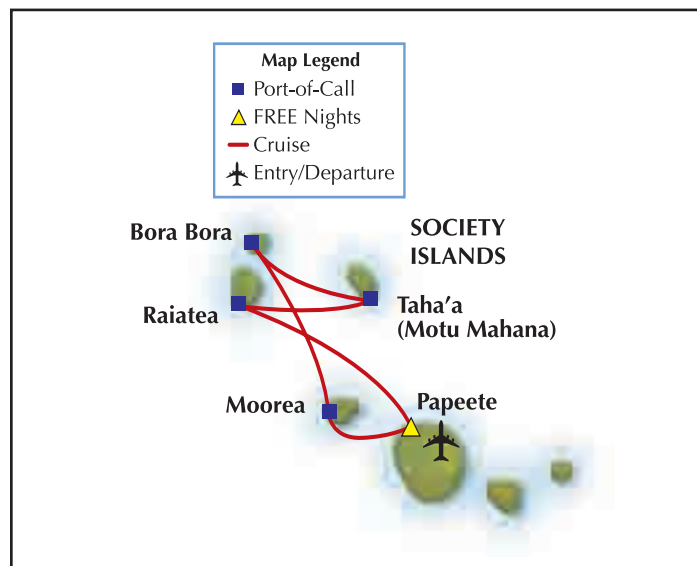

Destination Information

French Polynesia

Tahiti and her neighboring islands cover over two million square miles of the South Pacific Ocean and are comprised of 118 islands spread over five great archipelagos. Many islands are crowned with jagged peaks while others appear to barely float above the breaking waves. Spread over an area as large as Western Europe, the total land mass of all French Polynesia's islands adds up to an area only slightly larger than the tiny state of Rhode Island.

The three archipelagos most sought by visitors are the Society Islands, comprised of Tahiti, Moorea, Bora Bora, Huahine, Raiatea, and Taha'a; The Tuamotu Atolls, or "Tahiti's Strand of Pearls," that include the atolls of Rangiroa, Manihi, Tikehau, and Fakarava; and the Marquesas, or "The Mysterious Islands."

Bora Bora, Society Islands

Bora Bora is possibly the single most famous island in all the world. The legends, mysteries, and romance associated with the words "Bora Bora" bring an almost mystical presence to the island. It was the prototype of Rodgers and Hammerstein's eternally enchanted isle of Bali Hai, and its spectacular lagoon was described by author James Michener as "the most beautiful island in the world." Part of the allure has to be its almost unbelievable beauty. Two towering peaks of sheer black rock dominate the center of the island and make an impressive backdrop to an assortment of blue waters that will dazzle the eyes. Bora Bora's lagoon is its most treasured feature, and allows the traveller many opportunities to experience it in a variety of ways: windsurf, jetski, scuba dive, swim, bask in its warmth ... the list goes on.

Moorea, Society Islands

Moorea is everyone's dream of the South Pacific with its jagged peaks cloaked in lush greenery. Many people have described Moorea as the most beautiful place on earth. Here, you'll find the real South Seas' experience — a casual, barefoot existence amidst white-sand beaches and multi-hued lagoons surrounded by jagged mountains and volcanic spires that reach into the clouds, while below, valleys are blanketed with the colors that one only finds when tropical climates meet rich, volcanic soils.

Papeete, Tahiti, Society Islands

Tahiti is French Polynesia's largest and most glamorous tropical island — and home to its unique capital city of Papeete, which is surrounded by an artist's palette of lush greens, blushing reds, warm browns, and vibrant blues of the island's blissful landscapes and crystalline seas. Sometimes called the "Island of Love." Tahiti is also the most populated of the 118 islands and atolls that comprise French Polynesia and, of course, the most famous.

Tahiti's city of Papeete is like no other city in the world, and it's filled with a unique energy unto itself. As French Polynesia's capital and center of business, its population is reported to be between 90,000-120,000 people, depending on where the city limit is defined — accounting for well over half of Tahiti's overall population of 180,000 people. As the starting and finishing point of *m/s Paul Gauguin* cruises, you'll have a couple of days to explore this city and, like those who came before you, recognize this country for its many faces beyond that of a mere vacationland. There's simply no place on earth quite like it.

Raiatea, Society Islands

The largest of the leeward islands, Raiatea is totally surrounded by a reef but has several navigable passes and the only navigable river in French Polynesia. Raiatea shares a protected lagoon with the island of Taha'a. Here, you can discover fascinating underwater scenery within Raiatea's deep lagoon, which is rich with fish and surrounded by mountains. The island offers lush green valleys, numerous waterfalls, and pineapple and vanilla plantations.

Taha'a & Moto Mahana, Society Islands

Taha'a and Raiatea share a wonderful lagoon rich in sealife and watersports activities such as scuba diving, windsurfing, and outrigger canoeing. The surrounding waters of both Raiatea and Taha'a Islands are also known the world over for their legendary sailing, yachting, and sportfishing opportunities. Taha'a's nickname is the "Vanilla Island" — because of its constant rich aroma of vanilla. In fact, the island boasts a full 80% of all Tahiti's vanilla production. Both Islands are also inundated with pearl farms legendary for their superb quality, high aesthetic appeal, and value.

Motu Mahana on Taha'a is Regent Seven Seas Cruises' exclusive retreat where *m/s Paul Gauguin*

passengers can snorkel in a turquoise lagoon, sip cooling libations at a floating bar, be entertained by pareu-clad Gauguines singing a beguiling welcome, and enjoy the intensely colored sprays of purple bougainvillea spilling over the trees.

Los Angeles, CA

Los Angeles conjures up images of glitz and glamour, sunshine and showbiz, and, perhaps most of all, the California good life. For a city that seems to promise so much, LA most certainly delivers, at least for the thousands of visitors that flock to this Southern California gem.

Los Angeles is the United States' second largest city, a vast area that stretches 76 miles along the Pacific coast. In fact, the metropolitan area known as Los Angeles is made up of 88 incorporated cities that range from Los Angeles proper, Hollywood, and Beverly Hills, to Pasadena, Santa Monica, and the sprawling San Fernando Valley. Each of these areas has its own unique atmosphere and style. Chic Beverly Hills is known for its shopping (Rodeo Drive is world-famous) and celebrity mansions, while Malibu is the quintessential Southern California beach town, complete with beach babes and golden sands.

Founded by Mexican settlers in 1781, Los Angeles grew from a cowtown to a Gold Rush boomtown to an oil town. Throughout the years, the city has lured new comers with the same qualities that draw settlers today: a mild climate, gorgeous landscape, and plenty of sunshine. But the city's fortunes and appeal truly boomed in the 1920s when it became the center of the growing film industry. Today, Los Angeles is home to the world's major studios and is known as the "Entertainment Capital of the World."

General Destination Information

Travel Documentation

The following information applies to U.S. and Canadian citizens only. Those travelling on other than a U.S. or Canadian passport should contact Vantage and the embassies or consulates of the countries they are visiting for further information and special requirements.

Immigration Information Request Form

Approximately 60 days before you depart, you'll receive a cruise line guest registration and an immigration information request form. You must fill out this form promptly and return it to the cruise line. **Without this information, your final documents will not be released.**

Passport and Visa

Passports are required for your cruise. **Your passport must be valid for at least six months after the scheduled return date of your vacation.** Bring with you a photocopy of the pages of your passport that contain your personal information and extra passport photographs. These are useful in the event of loss.

Tipping Guidelines

"Country club casual" or elegant resort wear are appropriate for all evenings on board. No ties are required at any time, although gentlemen may wish to bring one blazer to wear on the evening of the Captain's Welcome Reception. For ladies, pantsuits or informal cocktail attire are recommended. Please note that jeans, shorts, and tee-shirts are not appropriate for evening wear on board.

Money Matters While On Board

For your convenience at the time of embarkation, Regent Seven Seas Cruises will request a confidential registration of an accepted credit card. The night prior to your final disembarkation from the ship, a detailed statement of your shipboard charges for on board services and products will be delivered to your suite or stateroom. All such charges must be paid in full by cash, travellers' check, or accepted credit card (Visa®, MasterCard®, Discover®, American Express®, Diners Club®).

Currency Exchange

The U.S. dollar is the standard currency aboard the *m/s Paul Gauguin*. The currency in French Polynesia is the French Pacific franc (XPF). The ship does not handle currency exchange on board. U.S. dollars are accepted for exchange at most ports-of-call, as are travellers' checks and major credit cards.

Tipping is not customary in Tahiti; it is not necessary to leave tips in restaurants or tip cabdrivers unless you wish to reward some truly exceptional service.

General Information About Your Ship

Air Conditioning

All cabins and public rooms on board are fully air-conditioned. Individual cabin temperature can be regulated by passengers.

Electrical Current

The standard electrical voltage on board is 220 volts. In the bathrooms you will find a 110-volt AC outlet to accommodate most U.S. standard shavers. There are both 220 and 110-volt AC outlets in the stateroom beside the dressing table mirror. Hair dryers are provided in all staterooms.

Keeping In Touch

The ship is equipped with state-of-the-art worldwide communications systems. You may make telephone calls directly from your stateroom using a major credit card. Faxes can be sent from the Reception Desk. Please note that charges for maritime satellite communications are significantly more than land systems. E-mail can be sent for a nominal fee, 24 hours a day, through on board workstations located in the Card Room on Deck 5.

E-mail services for sending and receiving messages are available for a fee, 24 hours a day.

Telephone/Fax

Ship-to-shore phone calls and fax transmissions are available at **standard tariffs**. Fax reception is complimentary; fax messages are received and sent through the reception desk. Should your friends, relatives, or business associates wish to reach you aboard ship, they can. The most economical way for someone to contact you by phone when the ship is sailing is to call 1 800 MARISAT. A satellite telex will be delivered to your cabin, and you can then call the party via satellite. At a more expensive rate, you may be contacted direct via the High Seas Operator 1 800 SEA-CALL.

Laundry

Laundry and valet services including pressing and dry cleaning are available with charge and may be arranged through your Stewardess.

Medical Facilities

The ship has a licensed and registered doctor and nurse for professional and emergency services, which are available at customary charges. The ship's medical center is designed to provide medical care for certain temporary illnesses and accidents, and are not intended or capable of providing on-going treatment of pre-existing medical conditions. For guests requiring oxygen equipment, an oxygen concentrator is the only form of oxygen equipment allowed aboard ship, and it must be provided by the passenger. RSSC wheelchairs on board are for emergency purposes only.

There is one wheelchair accessible cabin on board, making such accommodations very limited and available on a request basis only. If you are wheelchair-bound, please consider a different cruise vacation.

Please note that Medicare and U.S health insurance are generally not accepted on board ships or in foreign destinations. Claims are made upon return to the USA and should be filed through your health insurance provider or through the Travel Protection Plan if you have purchased it. All receipts and doctors reports are required to process claims.

Special Cabin Requests

Although the special group rate you have taken advantage of on your Vantage cruise does not guarantee cabin selection, we will be happy to advise the cruise line of any special requests. We must receive your request at the time of booking. Periodically, cruise lines randomly upgrade passengers for space allocation purposes. Please keep in mind that these upgrades are at the discretion of the cruise line and selection of passengers to be upgraded is not in Vantage's control.

Smoking Policy

Certain public areas have been designated as non-smoking areas. Generally, the portside (left side) of the ship is non-smoking and the starboard side (right side) allows for smoking. The Connoisseur Club allows smoking, and there are no restrictions concerning smoking in stateroom/suites.

Water Sports & Dive Program

Sea and weather permitting, *m/s Paul Gauguin's* self-contained Marina offers many complimentary options for watersports enthusiasts including windsurfing, waterskiing, and kayaking. Snorkel gear is provided at no charge for use on optional shore excursions or for your own enjoyment once on shore. An optional full scuba dive program, accommodating all levels of expertise, is available for a fee.

Before You Go on Your Trip

Vaccinations

While it is not Vantage's policy to require health certificates from a physician, we do ask that you exercise good common sense when preparing for travel to French Polynesia. The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) urges travelers to French Polynesia to take certain health precautions. Please review with your doctor the following information from the CDC. Discuss your itinerary and length of port stays with your physician and be guided by his/her advice as to whether or not you should obtain any of the inoculations discussed below.

Hepatitis A or IG: The CDC recommends that travelers to French Polynesia receive the vaccination for Hepatitis A or the equivalent IG (immune globulin) injection. You should receive this inoculation at least four weeks prior to your departure. Do not be overly concerned. Hepatitis A is transmitted by contaminated food and water, and it's extremely unlikely that you'll encounter it on shore excursions or aboard ship, where every precaution is taken to provide healthy meals and purified drinking water. The inoculation is simply a prudent safeguard.

Typhoid: The CDC recommends a typhoid vaccination for travel to French Polynesia. This needs to be done two weeks before your arrival overseas.

Booster Vaccinations: As a general rule, the CDC also recommends adult booster vaccinations as needed for polio, diphtheria, and tetanus for any travel done outside the U.S. and Canada. One Td inoculation provides protection against both tetanus and diphtheria

and is effective for 10 years. Plan to get your Td vaccination at least 10 days before your departure.

Carry-On Bags With Wheels

The popular roll-aboard carry-on bags often do not fit in overhead compartments, particularly on motorcoaches. If you must bring a wheeled carry-on bag, be sure to include the size of the wheels when you measure its dimensions. Select a lightweight style with recessed wheels which protrude minimally from the base of the suitcase. On motorcoaches, any luggage with wheels must be stowed in the luggage compartment underneath the coach.

Luggage Tags

All checked luggage should be tagged with the Vantage Luggage Tags included in your travel document wallet as well as the Regent Seven Seas Cruises Tags provided. Luggage tags will facilitate delivery of your bags. Before you leave home, please indicate your name, address, and telephone number on your Vantage Tags and your name and cabin number on your Regent Seven Seas Cruises Tags. We also suggest that you place identification inside all luggage as a safeguard.

Shore Excursions

Regent Seven Seas Cruises' "Shore Excursions" booklet will be provided in a mailing prior to your departure. This booklet will provide detailed descriptions of the excursions offered by the cruise line including degree of difficulty, meals, and tour highlights. You will have the opportunity to purchase these tours while on board ship through your Vantage Program Manager.

Regent Seven Seas Cruises passengers may pre-request shore excursions on the cruise line's Website: www.rssc.com. This user-friendly site allows passengers to login or set up a personal account by clicking on the "My Cruises" tab. Next, locate your sailing by either clicking through "My Cruises" to the "My Booked Cruises" section, or searching in the "Plan a Voyage"

section for the sailing and clicking on the "Ports & Excursions" tab, then the "Request Excursions" button. Please note that the pre-request option is not operational until 60 days before departure. Passengers are then asked to confirm their ship, booking number, last name, and departure date. A confirmation e-mail is then sent to you, and you'll find your shore excursion tickets in your stateroom/suite upon embarkation. Charges are put on shipboard accounts.
